Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI)	-In Jumping: Any Athlete who is ranked in the top 500 of the FEI Jumping World Rankings; -In Dressage: Any Athlete who is ranked in the top 300 of the FEI Dressage World Rankings; -In Eventing: Any Athlete who is ranked in the top 300 of the FEI Eventing World Rankings; -In Para Dressage: Any Athlete who is ranked in the top 100 of the FEI Para Dressage World Rankings; -In Endurance: Any Athlete who is ranked in the top 100 of the FEI Endurance World Rankings; -In Driving: Any Athlete who is ranked in the top 100 of the FEI Driving World Rankings; -In Vaulting: Any Athlete who is ranked in the top 100 of the FEI Vaulting World Rankings; -In Reining: Any Athlete who is ranked in the top 100 of the FEI Reining World Rankings; and -Any Athlete who is included in either the Registered Testing Pool and/or the Testing Pool. The relevant Ranking(s) for determining whether an Athlete shall be considered an International-Level Athlete shall be the Athlete's Ranking on 1 January of each relevant year and shall apply until 31 December of the same calendar year. Fédération Internationale d'Escrime (FIE)	(a) Fencers who are in the FIE Registered Testing Pool and Testing Pool (if one is established); and (b) Fencers who are ranked in the top 64 in each of the 6 senior weapon categories at the start of each senior season. These rankings are published on the FIE's website. To be clear the world rankings before the first senior FIE World Cup or Grand Prix of the season and after the end of the previous season will be used. These fencers will stay in the International Level pool for one year until the list is updated.	FIE Website

International Hockey Federation (FIH)	(a) Athletes who compete in all FIH International Events and/or Competitions published by FIH in its website (b) Athletes who are part of the FIH's Registered Testing Pool; (c) Athletes who are part of the FIH's Testing Pool;	FIH Website

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International Luge Federation (FIL)	(a) Athletes who compete in any of the following International Events: any event under the jurisdiction of FIL, particularly World Championships, Continental Championships, World and Continental Cups, others from Congress or from Executive Board approved competitions; (b) Athletes included in FIL's Registered Testing Pool and Testing Pool, if any. International Biathlon Union (IBU)	1.2.3 All Athletes who participate in an International Competition as defined in the IBU Constitution will be considered to be International-Level Athletes for purposes of these IBU Anti-Doping Rules, and therefore the specific provisions in these IBU Anti-Doping Rules that are applicable to International-Level Athletes (as regards Testing, TUEs, whereabouts information, Results Management, and appeals) will apply to them. [Comment to Article 1.2.3: As per the definition of 'International Competition' in the IBU Constitution, the Competitions covered by Article 1.2.3 include '(a) the Biathlon programme of the Olympic Winter Games; and (b) the Biathlon World Championships, Youth/Junior World Championships, IBU World Cup events, IBU Cup events, continental championships, continental cups, regional cups, and all other competitions (winter or summer) that are now or in the future organised by or on behalf of the IBU between Athletes or teams of Athletes representing different Countries'.]	IBU Website

International Weightlifting Federation (IWF)	(a) Athletes who are part of the IWF's Registered Testing Pool and Testing Pool; (b) Athletes who participate in IWF Events. (c) Athletes who are registered to participate in IWF Events. Such Athletes are already considered as International-Level Athletes during the two-month period prior to the IWF Event in question. If the Event is a World Championship (Youth, Junior and/ or Senior), then the period shall be of at least 3 months prior to the Event in question. The Member Federations shall transmit the list(s) of Athletes entered to compete in the IWF Events in accordance with Article 5.5.16 of the Anti-Doping Rules	IWF Website
Ju-Jitsu International Federation (JJIF)	(a) Athletes with the following ranking: 1-10 in the JJIF Ranking list, available on the JJIF website (www.jjif.org); and (b) Athletes who compete in the Continental and World Championships or any other Event organized by JJIF or where JJIF is the ruling body. Tug of War International Federation (TWIF)	(a) Athletes included in the TWIF Registered Testing Pool, Testing Pool and any other pool if established by TWIF; (b) Athletes who intend to compete at a formal TWIF International Championship or World Games where TWIF accreditation is required to participate. Having competed at such an event the Athlete shall be deemed an International Athlete for a period of 12 months.	TWIF Website
Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI)	Within the overall pool of Persons set out above who are bound by and required to comply with these Anti-Doping Rules, the Riders included in the UCI Registered Testing Pool or the UCI Testing Pool shall be considered to be International-Level Riders for the purposes of these Anti-Doping Rules, and, therefore, the specific provisions in these Anti-Doping Rules applicable to International-Level Riders (e.g., Testing, TUEs, Whereabouts, and Results Management) shall apply to such Riders. For purposes of Articles 7, 8 & 13, it shall be sufficient for a Rider to be regarded as International Level Rider that he or she is or was included in the UCI Registered Testing Pool or in the UCI Testing Pool either at the time of the Sample collection, or at the time an investigation or a review under Article 7 is initiated against him or her. World Archery (WA)	(a) Athletes who are part of the World Archery Registered Testing Pool and Testing Pool; (b) Athletes who participate in the following World Archery International Events: World and Continental Championships, the Olympic Games, World Ranking Tournaments, Olympic Qualification Events (Continental Qualifying Tournaments), the Archery Events held by Major Event Organisations (for example World Games); and any other Event for which World Archery (or it's respective Continental Associations) is the organizer, ruling body or where the WA appoints technical officials. World Baseball Softball Confederation (WBSC)	(a) Athletes included in the WBSC Registered Testing Pool, Testing Pool and any other pool if established by WBSC; (b) Athletes including para-Athletes who participate in the following WBSC International Events: WBSC World Cups and WBSC World Cups Continental qualifiers (for all disciplines but excluding Events involving Minors), World Baseball Classic and World Baseball Classic qualifiers, Premier12, Olympic Games and Olympic Games qualifying Events.
